TARGET AUDIENCE:

Headmasters, teachers and school education staff of all grades and types of schools, including pre-school institutions, social pedagogues

COURSE LANGUAGES:

German; translation into English and French is possible

MOTIVATION:

The work of educators is becoming increasingly difficult today due to learning disorders and resistance, harmful group effects as well as conflicts and crises, exacerbated by social upheavals and impending catastrophes. In the Gestalt pedagogical training, the participants not only learn helpful methods to promote the individual learning requirements and the climate in the learning groups, but they also reflect on their personal attitude, expand their personal, didactic and social skills and learn the gestalt pedagogical principles by combining Know how to convey information with biographical experience so that learning can gain personal meaning.

METHODOLOGY:

Exercises to clarify the principles of humanistic psychology (e.g. authenticity and personal responsibility), gestalt psychology (e.g. working with the conciseness of Gestalts) and neurobiological research (e.g. learning with enthusiasm); exercises on self-awareness and empathic communication, experiments to clarify the personal attitude in connection with the selected module, experience-activating activities to reflect on the own learning history and the current school situation, experiencing teaching examples, staging problematic situations with testing of alternatives. The seminar is designed process-oriented (according to the requirements of the group process) and with internal differentiation (exercises and experiments are carried out together in the large group, the work on the modules is carried out individually online and in small groups based on Gestalt psychology and brain research

LEARNING OUTCOME:

Refinement of perception and creative expression;

Exercise of self-awareness and empathy; Authentic communication with and without language;

Promoting a friendly group atmosphere; Linking learning content with the current situation:

Gestalt-specific handling of resistance, conflicts and crises;

Every module is offered on every session. The institutions can send 1-4 participants. The course leaders work with groups of 5-15 participants.
